This issue is all about putting the 'A' back in equity acronyms. We know that disability is a spectrum and accessibility benefits everyone. We want to know how the big 'A' has played a role in your work and life. We're excited to announce that this will be our first text-based issue of Alki. Submissions could include the following:

- Art, creative writing, opinion pieces, or articles written by disabled members of our community
- Navigations through legal accommodations processes and how copyright got in the way
- Programs, events, and partnerships that have enriched your library's service to the disabled community
- Assessments, audits, and renovations that have made your library's physical (or virtual) space more accessible
- Technical knowledge essential for making library catalogs, websites, software, hardware, and electronic resources more accessible to the print disabled
- Virtual tours and spotlights on local organizations and institutions that center accessibility as their core mission
- Research-driven and persuasive pieces on the importance of accessibility in libraries, schools, museums, archives, and other cultural institutions

Alki is a journal by and for the Washington library community. We accept submissions that may not fit our theme but are still important to our

community.

- Title
- Author name(s) and affiliation(s)
- Short, third-person bio and headshot of author(s)
- Text of article and citations using Chicago Manual of Style
- Images in .jpg or .png format with accompanying captions and alt text
- Pull quotes or short selections of your article that you would like highlighted in larger print
- Any specific formatting requests

Applications Open Today for NNLM Region 5 Funding

New funding opportunities from the Network of the National Library of Medicine (NNLM) Region 5 will be available soon. To help you prepare, they're sharing early information about the funding opportunities and timeline before publishing the Request for Applications (RFA).

Funding opportunities will include:

- Technology Equity Awards, 5 awards, up to \$5,000 each
 - Designed to support infrastructure that improves equitable access to biomedical and health information
- Collection Equity Awards, 7 awards, up to \$1,500 each
 - Designed to support collection development that amplifies diverse voices writing on health/medical topics

Timeline:

- **Nov. 30** the Request for Applications (RFAs) for Region 5 awards is published on nnlm.gov/funding with complete instructions for applying
- **On or before Jan. 24, 2023:** send an email to the Region 5 office (nnlm@uw.edu) stating your intent to apply. *Note: Region 5 welcomes applications from the same organization for both types of awards. However, Region 5 cannot fund more than one award per organization.*
- **Feb. 21, 2023:** application deadline
- **May 2023:** funded projects begin
- **April 2024:** funded projects are complete

discuss the various responsibilities and requirements of managing branches of the Washington State Library inside carceral settings. [Register in advance.](#)

Learn how prison libraries accomplish traditional services such as collection development, reference assistance, and interlibrary loan. The duo will also explain how ILS' unique Reentry Resources Request system helps combat recidivism and satisfies the information needs of librarianship's most underserved communities. Finally, be among the first to hear about the upcoming State Prison Libraries Performance Initiative, ILS' plan to begin networking state prison library systems throughout the country.

PLA: "Using Data to Engage Underserved Communities"

In 2021, the [Oak Park Public Library](#) in Illinois developed its first "Strategic Plan Against Racism." One component of this new plan is reaching underserved people in their community. Using data from the library's community engagement software, the library created a multi-channel, integrated marketing campaign that was specifically designed to reach different segments of the community that historically have been marginalized. Each campaign component had targeted messages and a call to action to raise awareness outlined in the strategic plan.

In this webinar on Dec. 7 from 11 a.m.-12 p.m. PT, attendees will learn how the campaign used a variety of marketing channels, a consistent message, and repetition — resulting in re-engagement of cardholders and new cardholder sign-ups at pre-pandemic levels. [Register now!](#)
