BORREGUITA AND THE COYOTE by Verna Aardema illus. by Petra Mathers

This Mexican tale tells of a small ewe lamb named Borreguita who time and again saves it's own life by outwitting a hungry coyote. The story is full of humor and the illustrations, by a Northwest artist, are a great addition to the book.

Activities:

* In the beginning of the book there is a glossary that lists a few Spanish words that are found in the story. Go over the words and ask the students if they know other words in Spanish.

CHARLIE ANDERSON by Barbara Abercrombie illus. by Mark Graham One cold night a gray cat walks out of the woods to Sarah and Elizabeth's house. The girls name him Charlie. Charlie comes every night to sleep on Elizabeth's bed, but disappears every morning after drinking a bowl of milk. It's not until a storm keeps him away that Sarah and Elizabeth discover a secret about Charlie; something they have in common with him.

Activities:

* Encourage children to share their experiences of pets who have wondered off to be found again.

Have children design a "LOST" poster describing Charlie.

Mucky was the muckiest, smelliest moose that ever lived. All the other animals were smart enough to keep their distance from Mucky, but not one huge, hungry wolf. The wolf tries time and again to have Mucky for dinner but each time Mucky's odor proves more powerful than the wolf. Students will delight in these illustrations done by the artist of "The Great White Man-Eating Shark".

Activities:

* Have the students write stories of their own that give new ways that the wolf can approach Mucky.

* How gross can Mucky be??? Give each student a picture of a "plain" Mucky to decorate

A boy imagines, (via Browne's surreal illustrations), changes around jin as he thinks about what his father said, "things are going to change around here."

Activities:

* Play the memory game. Tell the students to pay close attention to changes in the pictures as you read the story. Close the book and have students list as many changes as they can remember. Discuss the changes they observed. * Have students draw ordinary objects around the library or classroom. making changes as they imagine them.

FLY AWAY HOME by Eve Bunting illus. by Ronald Himler

A homeless boy living in an airport, moving from terminal to terminal with his dad, hopes that someday his life will be the way it was before his mom died. A thoughtful, poignant book that will be sure to prompt emotion and discussion.

Activities:

* Brainstorm a list of social issues. Have students bring in related articles. Discussion leads to awareness.

* Have a canned food, clothing, or toy drive. Research Second Harvest and other agencies involved in gathering and distributing food and clothing.

Barely clearing elecrical wires due to the weight of 5000 lbs of fuel, Charlies Lindberg commences his historic flight of 1927. Dramatic full-page illustrations capture hours of tension in the cockpit and the exultation of the landing.

Activities:

 \times * Plot Lindbergs route on a world map.

* Create a chart showing various types of transport between Paris and New York. Have students research, Concord, jet, steamship and sailing ship crossing times, comparing them to Lindbergs crossing time.

Activities:

* Play a round of Good News! Bad News! (oral activity)

* Create a positive-negative picture using black and white construction paper.

* Brainstorm a list of opposites. Share books about opposites.

Exquisite photographs and an informational paragraph accompany each letter of the alphabet, dedicated to a creature of the sea.

Activities:

* Pinpoint the habitat of each animal on a world map * Create real or fictitious soft-sculpture fish. Design, paint, and cut-out the two sides. Staple and stuff the fish with paper.

Guiberson provides the analogy of a hotel to explain the importance of the Saguaro cactus to numerous desert dwellers. Charming watercolor illustrations by Megan Lloyd and a story-like quality to the text make this non-fliction book fun and factual.

Activities:

* After having the students draw a picture of a Saguaro, have them list or draw all of the animal that inhabit it.

* Have the children paper-sculpt a whale and draw a pond to put it in.
