Current Impact in Washington

- 116 medical practice locations
- 28 counties with programs
- More than 65,000 children served/yr
- More than 700 medical providers participating
- Includes 14 Tribal, 6 Military, and 46 Community Health Center programs



An Evidence-Based Early Literacy Program in Doctors' Offices

At each check-up from age 6 months through 5 years

Books for Children: Doctors and other primary care providers give each young child **a brand new book** to take home and keep

Advice and Support for Parents: Doctors talk with parents about the importance of reading aloud, and give age appropriate tips

Early Literacy Skills: Helps families and communities encourage early literacy skills by building on the unique relationships between parents and their children's doctors

\$300,000 to support Reach Out and Read in a biennium

- Maintains state funding that leverages over \$1.2 million in federal and private funding
- Leverages professional time of over 700 medical providers who *volunteer* to implement Reach Out and Read. If each one-on-one visit with a family were valued at \$25, this in-kind professional time is over **\$6.5 million dollars**
- **Builds community partnerships** to support parents as their child's first teacher, integrate doctors into education efforts, and build a statewide early learning system

A Strategic Investment in Early Learning

- A priority 2011 Early Learning Strategy for DEL, OSPI, and Thrive by Five
- Strengthens Washington's competitiveness for Striving Readers federal funding
- A vital part of a seamless educational system, starting from birth

Reach Out and Read is a Research-Proven School Readiness Initiative

- Science is unanimous the single most important thing that parents can do to prepare their children to succeed in school is to read aloud with them when they are young
- 14 published research studies have shown Reach Out and Read's effectiveness: parents read aloud more often; children show significant improvement in language skills

Provides Support Washington Parents Want

Washington State Department of Early Learning Parent Survey shows

- More parents trust and want to receive early learning information from their child's health care provider than any other source (71%)
- Washington parents want information about how to support their child's early reading and skills (69%)
