General Tips

- Validate this work
- Be positive
- Give time
- Seek out patrons
- Leave your personal preferences at home
- Suggest rather than recommend
- Understand the appeal of a book
- There is no one perfect answer

Having the Conversation

Tips for having the conversation

Questions to move a conversation:

- Tell me about a book you really enjoyed
- Have you read anything lately that you have really disliked?
- Is there an author you consistently read?
- Do you like books with _____? (cooking, international settings, love, etc.)
- Do you have any favorite TV shows?

Pitfalls to Avoid

- Value judgments
- Phrases like "well-written"
- Offering only one choice and... offering too many!
- Dead ends
- Making up a synopsis
- Apologizing for reading taste
- Negative comments about other authors, genres, etc.
- Guaranteeing "safety" or "likeability" of content
- Leaving the conversation closed

What to do if you can't help?

Too busy? Totally stumped? Italian vampire romance not available in the consortium?

- Reference intake form
- Get a <u>book suggestion form</u>
- Purchase request
- Consider a handoff (aka leverage your collective hive power!)
