Service Excellence in YOUR Library

Description: All library staff, regardless of job title, are in a service position. What is it that sets an organization's level of service apart from others? How can employing these techniques propel the good service we already provide in our libraries into great service?

Digitization 101

Description: This workshop will introduce you to many of the crucial steps involved in creating a successful digitization project, from material selection, copyright research and permissions gathering, digital reformatting, metadata creation, and providing online access. Participants will be given the chance to work hands-on with flatbed scanners, image editing software, as well as with controlled vocabularies and name authorities for creating metadata. A focus on navigating best practices and digitization guidelines will be established, along with balancing the needs of your library or organization.
