Dr. Carla Hayden Approved as Librarian of Congress



On July 13, the Senate approved the nomination of Dr. Carla Hayden to serve as the nation's 14th Librarian of Congress. Hayden, American Library Association (ALA) past president and director of the

Enoch Pratt Free Library in Baltimore, Maryland, is the first female and the first African American to lead the Library of Congress. She also is the first professional librarian to be confirmed in more than 60 years. Supercharged Storytimes Free Resources

An archive of the very successful OCLC WebJunction's Supercharged Storytimes pilot program is now available at no cost to any library staff member interested in strengthening their storytime practice with research-based early literacy concepts. The archive consists of five modules, each comprising a 1-hour webinar archive recording with links to online supporting materials, including:

- An overview of the Supercharged Storytimes online pilot program, originally offered to more than 500 library staff members in six states in 2015;
- Discussion forums where those enrolled can connect with others who have signed up;
- Help on ways to incorporate researchbased early literacy concepts into storytimes; and
- Resources that can help staff speak with confidence to parents, caregivers, and other library stakeholders about the learning that takes place during storytimes.

Participants who complete all 5 webinar archives will be eligible for a Certificate of Completion for 5 hours. Although the full orientation archive is provided as a self-directed learning experience, participants are encouraged to invite and engage their peers in

to lead not only within the library, but also in the community.

Developed in collaboration with the International City and County Managers Association (ICMA), and supported by a grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), the PLA Leadership Academy offers a groundbreaking focus on developing the skills needed to work with municipal officials and other community stakeholders to enhance the position of the library within the community and improve the overall effectiveness of library services and programs.

The Leadership Academy offers:

- A three and a half day, in-person educational /networking event
- A professional coach program with experienced public library leaders and city managers
- Development of real-world projects to implement at attendees' libraries

PLA, with support from IMLS, has made a strong investment in leadership training for its members and, as a result, is able to waive participant registration fees for this highly selective program. Participants will be required to cover travel costs and lodging. Interested participants must apply, submit two letters of recommendation and be accepted to participate in the PLA Leadership Academy. Applicants must be PLA members and MLS/MLIS librarians with at least five years of increasingly responsible experience in a public library. The application deadline is September 19, and applicants will be notified of their acceptance status by November 30. Attendance is selective and will be limited to twenty-eight participants.

The curriculum is designed by the PLA Leadership Development Committee with the assistance of ICMA and Adam Goodman, director of the Center for Leadership, Northwestern University, Evanston, Ill., and builds on PLA's previous leadership training initiatives.
