Meet the Creators of the March Trilogy Congressman John Lewis, Andrew Aydin and Nate Powell



Friday, August 19, 2016, 3-5pm King County Library System, Bellevue Branch

Congressman John Lewis is an American icon and one of the key figures of the civil rights movement.

His commitment to justice and nonviolence has taken him from an Alabama sharecropper's farm to the halls of Congress, from a segregated schoolroom to the 1963 March on Washington, and from receiving beatings from state troopers to receiving the Medal of Freedom from the first African-American president.

Now, to share his remarkable story with new generations, Lewis joins co-author Andrew Aydin and artist Nate Powell for the award-winning graphic novel trilogy March.

The event is free. Seating is limited. Books will be available for purchase and signing.

ALA Protocol for Monitoring and Responding to State and Local Library Crises

The American Library Association (ALA) has adopted a protocol to respond to library crises at the state and local level. The goal of ALA's involvement is to advance the advocacy efforts of the library and/or the appropriate state-level library organization. ALA can only become involved when its efforts are welcomed by and coordinated with the library and/or the statelevel library organization.
