Help Washington Libraries "Leap into Science"

The Franklin Institute Science Museum, the National Girls Collaborative Project, and the Institute for Learning Innovation are looking for libraries to partner with them to nationally disseminate science and literacy programming.

Five states will be selected to take part in a three-year curriculum training and statewide dissemination project. Two or three institutions per state are asked to apply as partners to disseminate the program in your state as a team. State team members will attend the National Leadership Institute at the Franklin Institute in Philadelphia on March 25-27, 2018. The application deadline is December 11.
