Make Libraries Grant Eligable

The U.S. Department of Education (the ED) has asked for public comment on their recently released "<u>Proposed Supplemental Priorities of</u> <u>Discretionary Grant Programs</u>." The American Library Association has encouraged library staff to ask the ED to make libraries grant eligible. Each time the Department of Education revisits its priorities is an opportunity for libraries to demonstrate the many ways we provide high-quality education for students of all ages, from early learners to lifelong learners. The ED is asking for public comment by Monday, November 13.
