K-12 Media Literacy Grant

The 2019 Washington State legislature has allocated \$150,000 in state funds for the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to establish a K–12 media literacy grant program in 2019–20. Six to ten school teams will receive grants to develop and share curriculum units focused on three subject areas: social studies, English language arts, or health classes.
