New Toolkits Available from ALA

The American Library Association has released two new tools to help library advocates and libraries across the country share their stories on digital platforms: a Live Stream and Video Storytelling Checklist and a Social Media Advocacy Toolkit. These are being rolled out in conjunction with the #MyLibraryMyStory initiative.

ALA has also released a **Critical Thinking Toolkit** through a collaboration with SAGE Publishing. Included are free graphics and messaging for libraries to raise awareness of their efforts to promote critical thinking.
