# ALA acclaims re-introduction of Build America's Libraries Act

ALA is <u>asking library advocates</u> to urge their senators to join as co-sponsors of the Build America's Libraries Act (S. 127).

**Reintroduced** on Friday, 1/29 by Sens. Jack Reed (D-RI), Bernie Sanders (I-VT), Sheldon Whitehouse (D-RI), and Ron Wyden (D-OR), the legislation would provide \$5 billion to support long-term improvements to library facilities, including addressing needs that have arisen due to COVID–19, to enable libraries to better serve rural, low-income and underserved areas, as well as people with disabilities and other vulnerable library users.

# San Diego State University Diversity Initiative to Support African American Community

San Diego State is <u>seeking to hire</u> nine tenure-track faculty with a demonstrated history of working with and supporting the African-American community. This cluster hire builds on the <u>Building on Inclusive Excellence</u> (<u>BIE</u>) program at SDSU by focusing on scholars who have an established commitment to teaching, research and/or service in and with the African-American community. # Special Grant Opportunity for Small and Rural Libraries
