ALA Libraries Transforming Communities Small & Rural Libraries Grants

The American Library Association invites libraries in small and rural communities to apply for grant funding by March 4 to help them address issues of concern in their communities.

Up to 650 U.S. libraries in small and rural communities will receive \$3,000 each to tackle issues ranging from media literacy to COVID-19 safety to unemployment. Grants will be awarded in two rounds in 2020 and 2021. For more information, contact the **ALA Public Programs Office**.

ALA acclaims re-introduction of Build America's Libraries Act

ALA is <u>asking library advocates</u> to urge their senators to join as co-sponsors of the Build America's Libraries Act (S. 127).

Reintroduced by Sens. Jack Reed (D-RI), Bernie Sanders (I-VT), Sheldon Whitehouse (D-RI), and Ron Wyden (D-OR), the legislation would provide \$5 billion to support long-term improvements to library facilities, including addressing needs that have arisen due to COVID–19, to enable libraries to better serve rural, low-income and underserved areas, as well as people with disabilities and other vulnerable library users.
