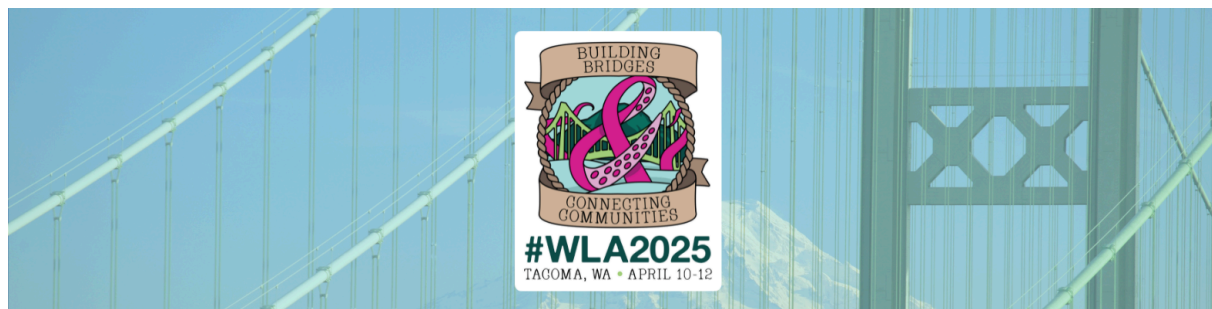

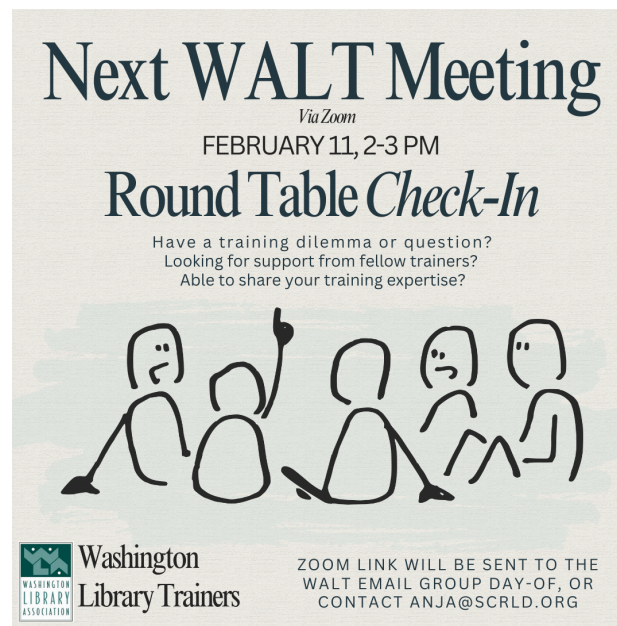

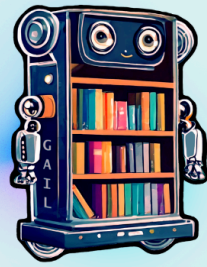
Trial By Flavor: Culinary Literacy at Mount Vernon City Library

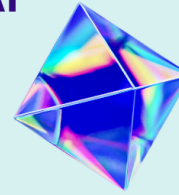
